There are many funding and grant opportunities available ranging from government run grant schemes, private funding, lottery grants etc. The following information has been provided to offer a general quide to schemes, grants and funds that may be available within the UK.

For Schools and Early Years Settings

Devolved Formula Capital is an amount allocated to schools each year to be spent on their buildings and other capital priorities. Can be used as funding for schools as part of renovations to their school playgroups. www.education.gov.uk

Awards for All - part of Big Lottery Fund

£300 - £10,000 Fundina: Deadline: Ongoing

Woodenspoon

£20,000 - £100,000 Deadline: Ongoing

Funding: Small grants up to £250 (three per/yr). Large grants over £250 and up to £3,000

(twice per/yr)

Deadline: Ongoing

Funding: Ranging from £100 to £500,000 dependant on project Deadline: Ongoing This innovative tax credit scheme enables operators of landfill sites to contribute money to enrolled Environmental Bodies to carry out projects that meet environmental objects contained in the Landfill Tax Regulations. Funding: Ranging from £250 to £500,000 depending on project Deadline: Ongoing Biffaward is one of the most respected Landfill Communities Fund schemes, and has awarded more than £100 million to worthwhile projects since 1997. Funding: Fast Track Fund - Up to £10,000, Core Fund - Up to £50,000

Deadline: Fast Track-3 per/yr, Core Fund-6 per/yr
